Sea turtles are large turtles that live almost **their** whole lives in the ocean. They hatch from eggs laid on land, but immediately enter the water. They can travel thousands of miles or kilometers across the seas. Their large flippers make them excellent swimmers. However, they are awkward on land, dragging themselves along with their flippers. There are several kinds of sea turtles.

Female sea turtles return to land only to lay eggs. They usually return to the beaches where they were born, even after traveling across the ocean. Newly hatched turtles scramble to the ocean to avoid being eaten by birds and other animals. Most male sea turtles never come onto land again.
